

State Visit of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi to Slovak Republic (14-16 June 2026)

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi paid a historic State Visit to Slovakia at the invitation of Prime Minister H.E. Mr. Robert Fico, marking the first-ever visit by an Indian Prime Minister to Slovak Republic since its independence in 1993.

Prime Minister held wide-ranging discussions with Prime Minister Fico and President H.E. Mr. Peter Pellegrini, covering bilateral relations and regional and global issues, including the Ukraine conflict, developments in West Asia and India-EU relations. He also met Speaker of the National Council H.E. Mr. Richard Raši and interacted with Slovak business leaders.

India and Slovakia agreed to elevate bilateral relations to a Comprehensive Partnership, providing renewed impetus to cooperation across diverse sectors.

Several agreements and MoUs were signed covering labour mobility, defence, higher education and research, digital technologies, cybersecurity, audio-visual cooperation, post-quantum technologies and naturopathy. The two sides also agreed to establish the first India Chair in Artificial Intelligence at the Technical University of Košice and a Joint Working Group on Counter-Terrorism.

The two countries will also establish a Consular Dialogue and work towards an early conclusion of a Social Security Agreement. Slovakia reiterated its support for India's permanent membership of an expanded UN Security Council.

Prime Minister was conferred Slovakia's highest state decoration, the Order of the White Double Cross, First Class, by President Peter Pellegrini in recognition of his contribution to India-Slovakia relations. Prime Minister dedicated the honour to the people of India and Slovakia.

The visit further strengthened cooperation in trade, technology, tourism, civil nuclear energy, AI, defence, healthcare and people-to-people ties, while providing fresh momentum to the growing India-EU partnership.

Prime Minister invited Prime Minister Fico to visit India at a mutually convenient date.

The visit marked an important milestone in India-Slovakia relations and reaffirmed the shared commitment to deepen the partnership between the two democracies.
